Baseball season is just around the corner. With receipt of this newsletter, registrations are being accepted for all returning players. In-person registration will be conducted on the first two Saturdays in February at Main Beach.

How to register for CLALL Baseball 2010

Our walk-in registration will take place at **Main Beach** on **February 6th & 13th between 9:00am—Noon.**

Walk in registration is available for anyone wanting to register in person.

All new players must register in person.

All new players to the league will be required to produce an **original birth certificate** for proof of age (photocopies will not be accepted). Also bring completed registration and medical waiver forms.

Returning players that do not wish to register in person can mail the enclosed registration form, medical waiver and payment in full to the address listed to the right.

There will be no online registration this year.

CLALL's four different levels of play:

- **Rookies-** an instructional coach pitch program for 5 & 6 year olds.
- **Junior Sluggers-** a semi-instructional machine pitch division for 7 & 8 year olds.
- **Minors-** a semi-instructional player pitch division for 9 & 10 year olds.
- **Majors-** a competitive play division for 11 & 12 year olds. See our try-out schedule below.

TRYOUT INFORMATION

Who must try out?

- All new 12 year olds who did not play in our League last year.
- All 11 year olds.

When does my child try out?

- All players with the last name starting with A-H, Saturday, February 20th, 1:45pm - 3:45pm.
- All players with the last name starting with I-O, Saturday, February 20th, 3:45pm - 5:45pm.
- All players with the last name starting with P-S, Saturday, February 27th, 8:15am - 10:15am.
- All players with the last name starting with T-Z, Saturday, February 27th, 10:15am - 11:45am.

Where are the tryouts?

Crystal Lake Central High School in the field house. Enter the building at the Walkup Street entrance.

What do players wear and what equipment are they to bring?

Dress comfortably in play clothes or sweats. Rubber-soled gym shoes are required. NO CLEATS. Boys should wear an athletic supporter with at least a soft protective cup. Bring a baseball glove. Although players may bring their favorite bat, it is unnecessary to do so.

What will players do at the tryout?

Run, throw, field grounders, field soft fly balls, hit pitches thrown by a pitching machine. Players will try out in small groups, and each group will rotate through a series of drill stations. The tryout will be run like an indoor practice.

Are parents permitted to watch the tryout?

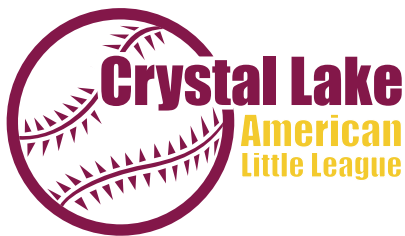
No. To maximize a safe, orderly and effective tryout, only managers and coaches are allowed to be in the field house and gymnasium during tryouts.

When will players be notified regarding team assignments?

The player drafts will occur March 5th and March 6th. Managers will notify the players the week of March 15th. Please wait for your child's team manager to call you after the draft is completed.

To be re-assigned to a different team, parents or guardians must write a letter to the CLALL Board clearly outlining reasons for this request prior to February 14th. The Board takes into account all factors for this proposed switch and decides the best course of action for the player, the team and the league.

April 3rd & April 10th: **Field Clean-up days** 8:00am-Noon at all fields.

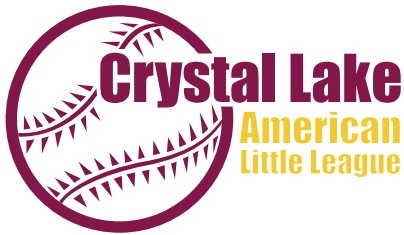
April 17th: **Opening Day Ceremonies** at Lippold Park at 8:00am, followed by a full day of games.
